## INTRODUCTION

Morgan Strong is a nonprofit organization dedicated to bringing expanded recreation to all residents of Morgan County.

This grassroots group of passionate citizens sponsored a needs assessment in an effort to determine how to prioritize and plan for expanded recreation programming and facilities for a growing county.

The project team consisted of Morgan Strong Board Members, community partners, Civic Canopy, and George K. Baum & Company. The mission of Civic Canopy is to work with, "Individuals, nonprofits, businesses, and government agencies to work more effectively together to solve increasingly complex social problems." Their expert staff worked with Morgan Strong to develop the Public Meeting format and assist with facilitation. George K. Baum & Company staff assisted with a citizen survey to learn public opinion related to proposed recreation projects and funding.

The entire project was self-funded by Morgan Strong. The main donors of Morgan Strong include The Colorado Health Foundation, The Dahms-Talton Foundation, Fort Morgan Cultures United for Progress, and visionary Morgan County residents.

The needs assessment results will be used in a feasibility study and financing plan to help make expanded recreation happen.

















## **METHODOLOGY**

The scope of this project considers public engagement and strategies to include private and public recreation users, non-users, municipal leaders, business leaders, recreation professionals, youth coaches, and administrators.

Those strategies include:

#### SIX PUBLIC MEETINGS

Brush! Fort Morgan Hillrose
Log Lane Village Weldona Wiggins

#### TWELVE STAKEHOLDER INTERVIEWS

Representing education, business, nonprofit, and youth coaching fields.

#### TWO RECREATION FOCUS GROUPS

Representatives from Brush! and Fort Morgan recreation departments.

#### CITIZEN SURVEY

Survey mailed to all registered voters in Morgan County to learn views on recreation amenities and potential funding models.





## **PUBLIC MEETINGS**

Public Meetings provide an ideal way for residents to speak openly about their experiences with recreation in Morgan County. Participants engaged in a series of open-ended questions in a relaxed atmosphere.

#### PUBLIC MEETING OBJECTIVES:

- Gain thorough insight into:
  - Challenges and weaknesses in current recreation programming.
  - Challenges and weaknesses in current recreation facilities.
  - Strengths and opportunities in recreation programming.
  - Strengths and opportunities in recreation facilities.
- Engage participants through an energetic and engaging format by using small groups and open-ended questions.
- Provide quality translation to attendees through qualified translators.

#### **PUBLICITY**

Morgan Strong publicized the public meetings through several channels including:

- Personal Invitations from Board Members
- Social Media
- Flyers (e.g. Flyers sent home in Friday Folders at Weldon Valley School District.)

## **PUBLIC MEETING QUESTIONS**

The following questions guided discussions during public meetings around Morgan County. The questions were developed based on the SWOT analysis. A SWOT analysis is a widely-used strategic planning technique to identify strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats.

#### **CURRENT REC PROGRAMMING & FACILITIES:**

- What recreation programming and facilities do you use in Morgan County?
- What strengths do you see in the current recreation facilities and programming in Morgan County?
- What don't you like or doesn't work well with the current recreation programming in Morgan County?
- What improvements would you make to current recreation facilities?

#### FUTURE REC PROGRAMMING & FACILITIES:

- What additional programs or activities do you feel should be offered in Morgan County that are not currently available?
- What improvements are needed at existing facilities?
- What additional recreation facilities would you like to see provided in Morgan County?
- How can a county-wide recreation program benefit all members of the County?
- Who isn't currently able to use community recreation services?
- Who can we partner with for a county-wide recreation program?

#### POTENTIAL CHALLENGES THAT MIGHT GET IN THE WAY



## **BRUSH! PUBLIC MEETING**

THE BRUSH! PUBLIC MEETING WAS A GREAT SUCCESS. CIVIC CANOPY HELPED FACILITATE AND RESIDENTS SHED LIGHT ON RECREATION PRIORITIES, INCLUDING IMPROVEMENTS TO THE BRUSH! OUTDOOR POOL.



## **BRUSH! HIGHLIGHTS**

#### **CURRENT REC PROGRAMMING & FACILITIES:**

- Participants use lap swimming, swimming lessons, adult rec leagues, driving range, youth leagues (soccer, flag football, t-ball). They noted that they use both Fort Morgan and Brush! facilities.
- Town of Brush! and Brush School District work well together on programming.
- Some participants liked the predictability of programming in Brush! and others want new, innovative programing.
- Noted the Fort Morgan Armory is too small.

#### FUTURE REC PROGRAMMING & FACILITIES:

- Participants discussed improvements to Brush! pool, like new changing areas.
- Discussed building a social space where teens can hang out.
- Desire more cooperation between towns and combine so there are more numbers for leagues.
- Desire for indoor swimming pool (waterslide, lazy river, net for volleyball).
- Discussed indoor amenities like trampoline jumping spaces, ball or foam pit, rock climbing, indoor paintball, laser tag, indoor track, music area.
- New organized sports like dodgeball, water polo, gymnastics.
- Increase adult classes like Zumba and yoga, and provide babysitting options.
- Include adaptive programming for special needs kids.
- Develop trails and more baseball fields in Brush!

## POTENTIAL CHALLENGES THAT MIGHT GET IN THE WAY

- Concern that private leagues will use facilities more than their fair share.
- Concern that rivalries between towns will prevent this from happening.
- Worried that organizers will not communicate the benefits enough to get support.
- Worried that politicians will not prioritize recreation.

#### **FUNDING:**

- Help families afford programming by establishing a scholarship fund.
- Fund new recreation through city and state government funding, taxes, and user fees.



## FORT MORGAN PUBLIC MEETING

## FORT MORGAN HIGHLIGHTS

#### **CURRENT REC PROGRAMMING & FACILITIES:**

- City of Fort Morgan Recreation has quality programming for young people.
- Participants use nature trail, outdoor swimming pool, swimming lessons, golf course, Romp & Stomp, frisbee golf, soccer, tennis courts.
- Participants feel armory is at its limit and in poor condition.
- Participants feel pool hours are not good for working families.
- Noted a lack of programming for adults.
- Noted a lack of vision for the city recreation department, need to publicize better, need to improve communication for non-English speaking residents.
- Dislike how cities do not currently work together and coordinate seasons (e.g. Fall versus Spring Youth Soccer).

#### FUTURE REC PROGRAMMING & FACILITIES:

- Participants discussed the need for indoor pool, two full sized courts, indoor soccer field, walking track, aerobic room, multi purpose room, childcare, weights, pool, and handicap services.
- Would like to see coordination with other cities for programming.
- More adult programming, expanded hours.
- Offer non-athletic programming like cooking and art.

#### POTENTIAL CHALLENGES THAT MIGHT GET IN THE WAY


- Participants discussed the need more volunteer coaches.
- Lack of open-mindedness in the community. Some people, especially seniors, are set in their ways.
- Concerned about "Self interested politicians."

#### **FUNDING:**

- Participants discussed various types of financial support and the majority of responses included the sentiment, "Everyone helps pay."
- This included conversations about sales tax, property tax, cities, and grants.



## HILLROSE PUBLIC MEETING

#### HILLROSE HIGHLIGHTS

#### **CURRENT REC PROGRAMMING & FACILITIES:**

- Participants use Star Pool, Brush! outdoor pool for swim team and movie nights, Brush Wrestling Club, High Plains Gymnastics, Brush Rec Baseball.
- Enjoy community events like movies in the pool and commented that recreation league baseball is well organized.
- Brush! has poor advertisement and a confusing website.

#### FUTURE REC PROGRAMMING & FACILITIES:

- Desire more adult classes and lessons after work hours and satellite fitness classes in Hillrose/Weldona (Yoga, Zumba, etc.).
- Improvements to Brush! pool, like private bathroom stalls and more inviting pool environment. Add fun pool features and programming like water aerobics class for young adults.
- Participants would like to see trails in Brush!
- Large recreation center with indoor pool and multi-purpose event rooms.
- More gym space to allow for more rec sports because schools aren't always available to public (e.g. during spring break).
- Find a way to create an organization that is inclusive of everyone in the county, not just town residents.

#### POTENTIAL CHALLENGES THAT MIGHT GET IN THE WAY

- Participants noted misunderstandings and "rumor mill" could be a challenge.
- Determining a funding model that everyone agrees on.
- Brush versus Fort Morgan (Old Rivalries).
- Outside Interests (Star and Body Firm).
- City Staff buy in to the special district model.
- Coaches and volunteers are difficult to find.

#### **FUNDING:**

• Sales Tax is a good model because more people pay.

## LOG LANE VILLAGE HIGHLIGHTS

## **CURRENT REC PROGRAMMING & FACILITIES:**

- Participants use Star Athletic Club (private gym), golf course in Fort Morgan, youth recreation leagues in Fort Morgan, Adult Softball in Wiggins and Brush, teens use free weights and treadmill at Fort Morgan Armory.
- The registration cost for youth leagues is affordable (\$35).
- Big challenges communicating deadlines for registration.
- Hard to find enough volunteer coaches for youth sports.
- Want updates to public restrooms in parks.

#### FUTURE REC PROGRAMMING & FACILITIES:

- Daddy Daughter Days and other family-focused events.
- Ability to rent gear for team sports.
- Easier registration, better platform for communicating new information and registration deadlines.
- New programming like tutoring, fitness classes, painting and cultural classes, fitness focused on girls and women.
- New sports like water polo and lacrosse.
- Things to keep kids from getting bored while parents are at work.
- Programs with hours for working people.
- Larger recreation center with basketball, racquetball, weights, elevated walking track, indoor pool, dance studio or multi-purpose fitness rooms.
- Have youth rec teams in all municipalities like Log Lane Village, Weldona, and Hillrose.
- Help kids and seniors find transportation to Rec Center.

#### POTENTIAL CHALLENGES THAT MIGHT GET IN THE WAY

• Concern that smaller communities won't be included.

#### **FUNDING:**

• Concern that businesses do not want more property taxes.







## WELDONA PUBLIC MEETING

## **WELDONA HIGHLIGHTS**

## CURRENT REC PROGRAMMING & FACILITIES:

- Participants use Fort Morgan swimming pool.
- Commented that programming is good for youth up to age eight.
- Experience challenges with Fort Morgan Recreation communication and cancellations.

#### FUTURE REC PROGRAMMING & FACILITIES:

- New Facility with indoor walking track, more multi use courts, party rooms, child care, and extended hours.
- Improve bathrooms at outdoor pool in Fort Morgan.
- Consider ice skating, laser tag, mini golf, area for teens, rock climbing wall, paint ball, hot yoga, dance, teen programming, bike and electric scooter rentals.
- New Outdoor area with ropes course and splash pad.
- Help seniors get more access to services.
- Connect kids and seniors to transportation "Rec Bus".
- New programming like Summer Camp, Kids Night Out, Daddy Daughter Events.
- Include rural communities like Weldona and Hillrose.
- Create a recreation calendar for any program in the county (Elks, Optimists, etc.).

#### POTENTIAL CHALLENGES THAT MIGHT GET IN THE WAY

- Location of new facilities.
- User fees might be too high for families to afford.

### **FUNDING:**

- Sales tax more favorable than property tax.
- Apply for grants.





## WIGGINS PUBLIC MEETING

#### **CURRENT REC PROGRAMMING & FACILITIES:**

• Participants use Fort Morgan outdoor swimming pool for open swim and swimming lessons, and Wiggins youth recreation baseball.

#### FUTURE REC PROGRAMMING & FACILITIES:

- Would like to see new programming like arts, crafts, agriculture, music, dance.
- Outdoor pool in Wiggins that is very kid friendly.
- Community Barn.
- Community Garden.
- Flexible scheduling- drop in type programs.
- More activities in Wiggins.

#### POTENTIAL CHALLENGES THAT MIGHT GET IN THE WAY

- Lack of communication between towns.
- Lack of funding.
- Drive time to participate.

#### **FUNDING:**

• User fees should be considered to help cover the costs.

INCLUDE TRANSPORTATION A PRIORITY TO HELP CONNECT YOUTH AND SENIORS TO RECREATION.

**DESIRE FOR EXPANDED PROGRAMMING** LIKE ART, COOKING, DANCE, & MUSIC.

BRAID FUNDING FOR SUSTAINABILITY AND INCREASED OPPORTUNITIES BY COMBINING **SMALL TAXES**, **MUNICIPAL FUNDING**, **AGRESSIVE GRANT WRITING**, **AND AFFORDABLE USER FEES**.

- Affordability
  - Low potential tax.
  - Affordable user fees.
  - Consider pricing package for large families.
- Professionalism
  - Retain quality recreation professionals.
  - High quality communication with community.
  - Improved registration system.
- Inclusive
  - Staff is culturally informed and receives training.
  - Provides services in languages spoken in community.
  - Accessible services for all physical abilities.

# GROUPS UNDERSERVED BY RECREATION SERVICES IDENTIFIED DURING PUBLIC MEETINGS

- Non-English Speakers.
- Residents with limited transportation.
- Home schoolers and empty nesters (not receiving flyers home in Friday Folders).
- Families who do not want to or don't have ability to do traveling leagues.





## RECREATION PROFESSIONALS FOCUS GROUP

Focus groups were held on February 25th, 2019 and April 26th, 2019 in an effort to learn about specific issues facing the six full-time recreation staff in the county.

Morgan Strong knew that our local experts in recreation programming would have important feedback on current challenges facing daily operations.

## MAIN TALKING POINTS FROM MORGAN COUNTY RECREATION PROFESSIONALS

- Staff understand that they serve other families from outside city limits. This makes funding streams and communication challenging.
- There was a consensus that the recreation departments are understaffed to help move the county forward. This is exceptionally challenging because recreation departments are not a priority in funding for a city when compared to streets, police, etc.
- Current staff would like to be included in transition planning if county voters approve a recreation district model. This plan will include the time line and process for hiring, salaries, benefits, and retirement plans.





## STAKEHOLDER INTERVIEWS

The overarching goal of completing stakeholder interviews was to learn opinions from Morgan County leaders regarding the value of recreation, current state of recreation, and what is needed to support recreation needs for all residents. Board members assisted in conducting over 12 interviews of Morgan County leaders in the economic development, medical, business, education, and youth coaching fields. The leaders live and work in Brush!, Fort Morgan, and Wiggins.

#### BENEFITS OF RECREATION IN MORGAN COUNTY:

"Recreation is what brings the community together."

"We are a community that likes to be active."

"Better recreation will make the community a preferred place to live"

"Programs are invaluable for our kids."

"Critical to recruiting new hires and retaining employees."

## POTENTIAL BENEFITS OF COUNTY-WIDE, COORDINATED RECREATION IN MORGAN COUNTY:

- More programs, facilities, and larger number of participants for leagues.
- Collaboration.
- Help keep families in the county for recreation, instead of traveling to Sterling,
   Greeley, and the Front Range.
- Help market our county, improve perception

#### STRENGTHS OF RECREATION IN MORGAN COUNTY

- A majority of stakeholders reported that youth programming is a strength.
- Outdoor space available in some cities.
- Registration is affordable.
- Private leagues help where public programs leave gaps.



## STAKEHOLDER INTERVIEWS, CONTINUED

#### WEAKNESSES OF RECREATION IN MORGAN COUNTY

- Challenge to get info out to the public- need better online presence.
- Registration is challenging for parents who don't speak English or have limited access to technology.
- Need to work more collaboratively with schools.
- Deadlines need to correspond with school schedules.
- City recreation is understaffed.
- Limited programming for adults ("Unless you want to join a gym, there is very little for adults to get involved in.")
- Over-reliance on school districts to provide all indoor gym space.
- Low quality public indoor facilities (i.e. Armory).
- Lack of Coordination between towns.
- No fall/winter/spring swimming options.
- Challenging to schedule adult activities, mostly because schools have the indoor space and must prioritize students.
- Need organized adult soccer and soccer facility.

#### NEEDED RECREATION PROGRAMMING & FACILITIES IN MORGAN COUNTY

- Additional programming for older adults, specific programs for girls (softball
  is only offered in one city), middle school level programming, adult soccer
  programming, and after-school programming.
- Walking and biking trails to connect towns.
- Consider transportation to facilities.
- Improvements to Brush! outdoor pool.
- Turf on fields (easier to maintain, more days of play because dries quickly).
- Fields dedicated for soccer and football with permanent seating.
- Indoor space that not owned by school district.
- Recreation Center with multi-use courts, indoor swimming pool, childcare.

- Local businesses (REA, Cargill, Western Sugar, Leprino, Transwest, Oil and Gas Companies).

#### IDEAS FOR FINANCING EXPANDED RECREATION IN MORGAN COUNTY

- Minimal Taxes, Sales tax most popular.
- Combine user fees, municipalities, and tax.
- Staff dedicated to grant writing.

## **CITIZEN SURVEY**

George K. Baum & Company conducted public opinion research conducted on behalf of Morgan Strong. The questionnaire served as an invitation for public reaction to a recreation improvements and funding proposal.

- The mail survey included a total of 20 questions, including one open-ended question. Included with the mail survey questions was a letter providing background information.
- The mail questionnaire used for this research is not a scientific poll, but a tool for collecting public input and understanding the general tone of the public's receptiveness to the issues presented.
  - The chief distinction is that this questionnaire was returned in lieu of people attending a public hearing (a non-representative sample of the registered voter population) as opposed to the returns representing a scientific sub-sample of the registered voter population. The results are subjective and limited in interpretation based on the volume of returns, not the science of returns. Think of this document as a written collection of comments from people who would have stood up and participated in a public hearing, but instead preferred to express their feelings through written form.
- Survey mailed to 8,556 households within Morgan County with expected 8-17% response rate.
- 1,196 replied (14% response rate) as of April 30, 2019.
- Previous mail surveys conducted by George K. Baum & Company have typically yielded response rates between 8 and 17 percent.

Tax sensitivity is not extremely high, with **59% OF RESPONDENTS INDICATING THEY ARE "NOT VERY CONCERNED"** or "somewhat concerned," compared to 37% who are "extremely concerned" or "very concerned."

Survey respondents were less supportive of the sales tax option, with 48% support



Most arguments in favor of the proposed improvements were more persuasive than arguments against, especially messages focused on IMPROVING QUALITY OF LIFE, HEALTH AND WELLNESS, and KEEPING THE COMMUNITY CONNECTED.
